127	Rule for regular comparison of Adjectives	Comparative: add <i>ior, ius</i> to the stem of the positive Superlative: Add <i>issums, issima, issimum</i> to the stem of the positive
128	Comparison of Adjectives ending in -er	Adjectives ending in <i>-er</i> add <i>-rimus</i> to the nominative masculine singular to form the positive. The comparatives follow the

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		regular rule
129	Comparison of <i>similis</i> , <i>dissimilis</i> , <i>facilis</i> , <i>humilis</i> , <i>difficulis</i> , and <i>gracilis</i>	They add <i>-limus</i> to form the superlative. The comparatives follow the regular rule.
130	Comparison of adjectives ending in <i>-us</i> preceded by a vowel	The comparatives and superlative are formed with the adverbs <i>-magis</i> and <i>-maxime</i> .
