US History Coursework Grading Rubric

Below is how you can expect that your weekly coursework is graded:

100: All questions are answered in complete sentences. The answers are full, complete, and correct. Through reasoning and textual support is given for answers where needed.

95-90: All questions are answered in complete sentences. The answers are correct and where appropriate, reasons are given. Reasoning and textual support is less complete than for a 100.

89-85: The student has conscientiously attempted to answer all questions. This is a good solid effort. Complete sentences may be lacking. Reasoning and textual support may be incomplete.

80-85: The questions are answered but with little or no explanation.

79-70: Some questions are not answered. Little sense of conscientiousness.

Below 70: It appears that the text has not been read and the student is going through the motions so that he or she does not receive a zero. Answers are missing, incomplete, or consist of one or two words.

Zero: Sharing or copying one another's coursework. Coursework over two weeks late without extenuating circumstances.

Late penalty: Grade is reduced by thirty (30) points.
